The nature festival, founded by late TAS Education & Grounds Chair Lewis "Brother" Milledge, features interactive activities and prizes and is designed for families with young children, students of every age, scouts, birders and naturalists. The major role our region plays on the Atlantic Flyway will be illuminated by Cape Florida Banding Station. To help scientists track our winter avian visitors, attendees can also learn how to participate in the February 16-19 "Great Backyard Bird Count."
